

Policy Statement

Introduction:

AKSSM Shevgaon recognizes that students have different learning styles and preferences, and that teaching methods should be flexible and inclusive to accommodate them. Therefore, the College has developed a policy for multiple modes of teaching to ensure that all students receive quality education, regardless of their learning style. This policy emphasizes experiential learning, participative learning, problem solving methodologies, brainstorming, focused group discussion, and online mode, to enhance student learning.

Policy Statement:

AKSSM Shevgaon acknowledges that students learn in different ways and that it is essential to provide multiple modes of teaching to meet the needs of diverse learners. As such, the College encourages the use of various teaching methods to promote effective learning and engagement among students. The following modes of teaching will be utilized in AKSSM Shevgaon:

- 1. Experiential Learning:** Experiential learning involves students engaging in real-world experiences related to their field of study. This mode of teaching is suitable for courses that require practical application and hands-on learning. The College will facilitate experiential learning by providing students with opportunities to participate in internships, apprenticeships, fieldwork, and community service projects.
- 2. Participative Learning:** Participative learning is an interactive teaching method that encourages active participation from students.
